Dick’s father is Harold Richard Johnson. The Johnson family members are Harold’s paternal ancestors, starting with Harold’s father, Alfred Peter Charles Johnson.

Dick's grandfather Alfred Johnson was born in the Buffalo area and lived most of his life there.



Alfred married Eva Irene Robins in 1915. Except for a brief time farming in the part of Ontario, Canada, where Eva was born, the Alfred Johnsons lived most of their lives in North Tonawanda, New York, a suburb of Buffalo.

In about 1952, Alfred and Eva moved to San Diego, where two of their children, Harold and Kenneth (Kenny) were already living. Daughter Evelyn and her Starr family followed soon after.

This is a photo of Alfred and Eva, along with Harold and his wife, Lillian (Dick's parents). They were all on vacation in Virginia Beach.

# The Dueger branch of the family

The Dueger (Düjer) family (Alfred's maternal line) also immigrated from Germany. They lived on a small farm in the Grand Duchy of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, which is on the Danish border.

The first six of Carl and Adolphiene's 11 children (including Dick's great-grandmother, Caroline Johanne Friederike Dueger) were born in Germany; the rest were born in the Buffalo area after they immigrated in 1872.

The following German census record shows Carl Düjer (line 1, born 1836), his wife Adolphiene, and their four oldest children.
