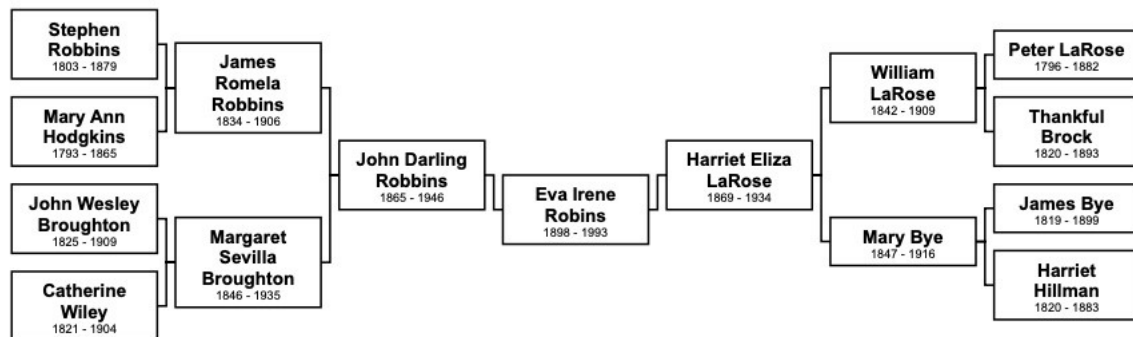

About the Robins family

Dick’s father is Harold Richard Johnson. The Robins family members are Harold’s maternal ancestors, starting with Harold’s mother, Eva Irene Robins.



Eva was born in the part of Ontario, Canada, that is just west of Buffalo, New York. Most of her family and immediate ancestors were also born in Canada, in and around the farming communities of Windham and Springfield, Ontario. The Broughtons, Byes, and Robins were probably originally from England, and the LaRoses probably came from France via Quebec.



Robins family migrations between the U.S. and Canada

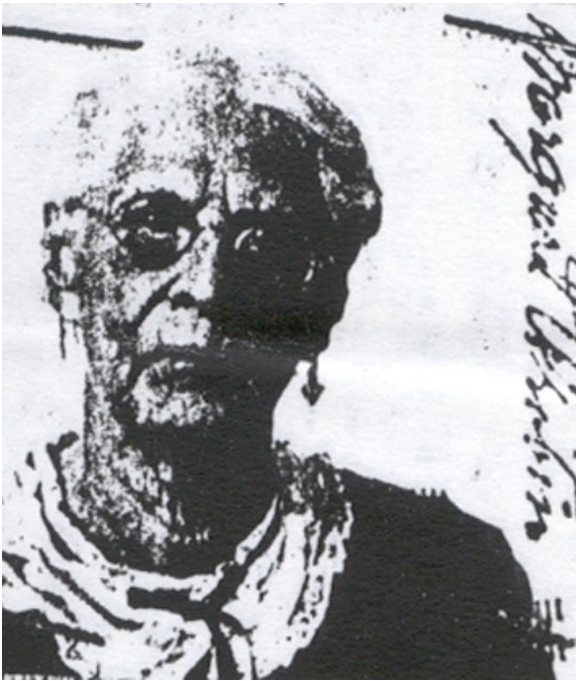

Some family members were farmers: for example, the Robins and Broughtons. Margaret Mary (“Little Grandma”) Broughton smoked a pipe and was reputed to have quite a strong personality.
