I've been experimenting lately with some of the newer iPhone apps for photo shooting and processing, thanks to some generous free education from two of our photo club members, Yvonne Camper and Bill Winn. I processed the photo above with Mobile Monet. I like it!

The way Mobile Monet works is when you open the photo you want to process it creates a b/w sketch, and then you "paint" it with your finger. You can paint all or some of it. I think this flower picture is better with only the flower in color and the rest in black and white. The original (see below) looks dull and uninteresting to me.

I took the picture with my Nikon V1 camera in Duluth, Minnesota, at the Glensheen mansion; I processed it in my iPhone 6 using Mobile Monet 2.5.
